

Welcome

Lenten Sentences:

P: In the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit. Amen.
Let us live this Lenten season - and always- with the cross before us.

C: Show us Your cross, Lord Jesus!

P: In times of prosperity, when success and comfort would draw us away from the way of the cross,

C: Show us Your cross, Lord Jesus!

P: In darker times of trial and worry when we feel alone and abandoned to wander in the valley of the shadow of fear or despair or death,

C: Help us see Your cross, Lord Jesus!

P: In the routine of each day, in the work we do, in our lives with family and friends, in the light of each day, and in our rest each night,

C: Help us see Your cross, Lord Jesus!

P: Heavenly Father, we sin against You and desperately need Your forgiveness won by Your Son. As a family of believers in this congregation, we pray that all we do together may be governed by your love for us in Christ.

C: Keep Christ's cross always before our eyes so that we are ever ready and eager to follow Him. Amen.

*♪ Hold thou thy cross before my closing eyes;
Shine through the gloom and point me to the skies.
Heav'n's morning breaks, and earth's vain shadows flee;
In life, in death, O Lord, abide with me! (588:7)*

P: Let us confess our sins.

C: Lord Jesus, we confess that our sins caused you to suffer and die. Our pride, our selfishness, our greed, our lust and our unfaithfulness were placed on you. Lord, have mercy on us who have sinned in so many ways throughout our lives.

*♪ Thou on my head in early youth didst smile,
And though rebellious and perverse meanwhile,
Thou hast not left me oft as I left thee.
On to the close, O Lord, abide with me. (588:4)*

P: This is how we know what love is: Jesus Christ laid down his life for us. Our many sins have been forgiven by his one perfect sacrifice. See his cross and there you see your Savior.

*♪ I fear no foe with thee at hand to bless;
Ills have no weight and tears no bitterness.
Where is death's sting? Where, grave, thy victory?
I triumph still if thou abide with me. (588:6)*

The Prayer: (in unison)

Jesus, bless me with your Spirit as I ponder your holy passion! The depth of my sin placed you in the pit of suffering. Because of my sin, I deserve wrath. Because of your tender mercy, I receive your forgiveness. Bless my observance of Lent to your glory and my eternal good as I see your cross and consider the price you paid to redeem me. Amen.

The Confession of Faith

Luther's Explanation to the 2nd Article

I believe that Jesus Christ, true God, begotten of the Father from eternity, and also true man, born of the virgin Mary is my Lord.

He has redeemed me, a lost and condemned creature, purchased and won me from all sins, from death, and from the power of the devil, not with gold or silver but with his holy, precious blood and with his innocent suffering and death.

All this he did that I should be his own, and live under him in his kingdom, and serve him in everlasting righteousness, innocence, and blessedness, just as he has risen from death and lives and rules eternally. This is most certainly true.
